Migration of the George ANTALEY Family

1. George ANTALEY. He married unknown.

Notes for George ANTALEY: Census 1790 Orangeburg District, South Carolina. Abraham's descendants in SC, George's in AL, John's in MS and Jacob's in LA. There is a branch of Antleys still in SC who may be descended from John thru a son named Benjamin. Abraham's branch is pretty well documented and Benjamin doesn't fit, nor does he fit with George or Jacob. Benjamin named his son and daughter, John and Catherine. This would fit with the brother John because the Catherine in the 1830 Orangeburg census as head of household is assumed to be his widow. There weren't a lot of Antley's around at that time so much can be assumed without documentation. This is also supported by the church records at Four Hole and Canaan . And this Catherine's obit states she was Rev Joseph's mother. The Antilley family of TX is descended from Abraham. Henry P Antley, son of Abraham, migrated to LA and married a Ms. Wallen. He then went into TX. Henry P. of TX married a Ms. Waller and is the correct age according to census records. Henry was the son of Abraham Antley.

Children of George ANTALEY were as follows:

- a. George ANTALEY (Jr), born 1774 in South Carolina; died in Dale County, Alabama. He married unknown.

Notes for George ANTALEY (Jr): George Jr. b. 1774, migrated to Thomas Co, GA after 1830 census and appears in the 1840 Thomas Co. census. He was in Dale Co AL by the 1850 census.

- b. Abraham ANTLEY, born 1784; died 1 Dec 1886 in Orangeburg County, South Carolina. He married Mary DANTZLER, born 6 Apr 1806; died 1 Oct 1885, daughter of Daniel DANTZLER and [--] POU.
- c. John ANTALEY. He married unknown. His son Joseph S. ANTALEY, born in South Carolina; died in Mississippi. John is believed to be the father of Rev. Joseph S. Antley who migrated to MS.
- d. Joseph ANTALEY.
- e. Jacob ANTALEY, born 1794 in South Carolina; died 8 Jul 1854 in Clarke County, Alabama. He married (1) on 19 Aug 1817 in Clarke County, Alabama Mary GILL, born abt. 1800; died abt. 1837 in Clarke County, Alabama, daughter of Richard GILL and Elizabeth MYRICK; (2) on 16 Jan 1838 in Clarke County, Alabama Mariah WHITE, born 1820.

Notes for Jacob ANTALEY: Jacob served for Rutledge of the 3rd Regiment South Carolina State Troops in the War of 1812. Jacob had migrated to Clarke Co AL by 1817 where he married Mary GILL. Her family were from the Edgefield, SC area. Jacob appeared as J. Antley age 56 b. SC, entry #44 in the 1850 Clarke Co AL census. His son, James migrated to Union Parish, LA in

the Autumn of 1850 (his words from Civil War Pension Application). Jacob's widow, Mariah, later migrated to Union Parish with their Antley children and some of her White relatives. On October 20, 1880 she filed for Jacob's pension from the War of 1812 from Lincoln Parish (form in 1870s from a portion of Union) stating he served for SC, they were married in Clarke Co AL and he died there. She couldn't remember much of the details of his service and thought it may have been for Collier and the application was filed under Autley, his service records being under Antely. Her application was denied.

Notes for Phillip ARANT: Migrated to Alabama.

- a. Jacob ARANT, born abt. 1804 in South Carolina; died 5 Sep 1878 in Butler County, Alabama. He married on 11 Sep 1833 in Lowndes County, Alabama Barbary TILL, born abt. 1807 in Orangeburg District, South Carolina; died 15 Jul 1882 in Butler County, Alabama, daughter of Nicholas TILL and Barbara BRUNNER.
- b. Michael ARANT, born 1806. He married Susannah FELKEL), born 1 May 1806, daughter of John Henry FELKEL and Margaret (DANTZLER) Felkel .
- c. Nathaniel S. ARANT, born abt. 1815 in Orangeburgh, South Carolina. He married Matilda Isabella M.E. BRYAN, born 28 Jan 1825; died 25 Aug 1878, daughter of Richard Jennings BRYAN and Lucy Ann ULMER.
- d. Martha ARANT, born 7 Oct 1817 in South Carolina; died 19 Jul 1890 in Lowndes County, Alabama. She married on 24 Jul 1836 in Lowndes County, Alabama John TILL, born 8 Feb 1810 in South Carolina; died 2 Mar 1896 in Lowndes County, Alabama, son of Nicholas TILL and Barbara BRUNNER.

1. Thomas BOLIN, born 1793; died 6 Jan 1856 in Marengo County, Alabama, son of Edward BOLIN (SR) and Anne Elizabeth SALLEY. He married (1) abt. 1815 [--] POSEY; (2) Rebecca SOJOURNER, born 1800.

Notes for Thomas BOLIN: Move to Wilcox Co. AL in 1826. Soldier in War of 1812. Married a Miss Posey in about 1815 and they had four children. At some point he married his second wife, Rebecca Sojourner. They had five children, all born in Wilcox County, Alabama. Thomas moved to Marengo County, AL in 1840 living near Hamden.

Children of Thomas BOLIN and [--] POSEY were as follows:

- c. William David BOLIN, born 13 Sep 1817 in Barnwell Co., South Carolina; died 10 Jul 1897 in Orangeburg County, South Carolina. 1. William BOLIN, born BET. 1776 AND 1783 in South Carolina; died in Alabama, son of Edward BOLIN (Sr) and Anne Elizabeth SALLEY. He married [--] POSEY, died in Alabama.

Migration of the Lewis Carnley Sr. Family

1. Lewis CARNLEY (aka Carnley, Sr., Carnline, Cantaline, Sr.) was born Abt. 1770, Amelia Township, St. Mathews Parish, Orangeburg District, South Carolina to George Christopher KIENTLEIN and Anna Maria CONTABINE. He died October 1843 in Pike County, Alabama, and was probably buried in Little Oak Methodist Church Cemetery a few miles southwest of Troy, Alabama. He married before 1810 Lovisa (aka Levica), last name unknown, in Lexington District, South Carolina. She was born about 1780, probably in South Carolina. She died about September 1851 in Pike County, Alabama and was probably buried beside Lewis.

Notes for Lewis CARNLEY Sr.: First appeared in S. C. records in 1808 as Lewis Carnline. Next in 1810 Lexington District S. C. census as Lewis Carnly. Migrated to Monroe County, Alabama, 1819, then to Pike County, Alabama ca 1835, died there in Oct. 1843. His surnames in probate records were Carnley, Carnline and Cantaline.

Children of Lewis CARNLEY Sr. and Lovisa _____ were as follows:

- a. Jacob CARNLEY/CARNLINE/CANTALINE/CARNALA, born about 1802, in Lexington District, South Carolina. He died after 1854, probably Pike County, Alabama. He m. Rosina CARNLEY before 1830, probably in Monroe County, Alabama. She died after 1854, place unknown.
- b. Abraham CARNLEY/CARNLINE/CANTALINE, born about 1805 in Lexington District, South Carolina, and died before 1851 in Pike County, Alabama. Whom and when he married are unknown, but the place was probably Monroe County, Alabama.
- c. Jeremiah CARNLEY/CARNLINE/CANTALINE, born about 1808 in Lexington District, South Carolina and died 17 August 1861 at Monroeville, Monroe County, Alabama. He married Mary KELLY on 26 May 1836 in Pike County, Alabama. She was born in South Carolina 24 August 1810 and died in Monroe County, Alabama 12 June 1893.
- d. Emily (aka Emeline, Millie) CARNLINE/CARNLEY, born about 1810, probably South Carolina, and died after 1880, Santa Rosa County, Florida. She married Gabriel CAPERS, 16 April 1836 in Pike County, Alabama.
- e. John CARNLEY/CARNLINE, born about 1816 in Lexington District, South Carolina and died in 1880 possibly of mental debilitation, in Pike County, Alabama. He married Cecelia Ann STAGNER 21 March 1844 in Pike County, Alabama. She died after 1893 in Holmes County, Florida.

- f. Daniel CARNLEY/CARNLINE/CANTALINE, born about 1818 in Lexington District, South Carolina, and died after 1870 in Texas. He married Rosannah HENDRIX 26 April 1838, in Monroe County, Alabama. She was born about 1813, probably in South Carolina and died after 1870, probably in Texas.
- g. William Henry CARNLEY, born about 1819, probably in Monroe County, Alabama, and died 10 Feb. 1909 in Nacogdoches County, Texas where he was buried at Swift Cemetery. He married Mary Ann BLANTON 25 July 1848 in Coffee County, Alabama. She was born about 1827 in Alabama and died about 1915 in Swift, Nacogdoches County, Texas.
- h. Lewis CARNLEY/CARNLINE, born about 1822, probably in Monroe County, Alabama. He died in Bradley County, Arkansas about August 1865, possibly of typhoid fever. He married (1) Isabel LANSDALE, 13 December 1847, in Pike County, Alabama. She was born about 1820, probably in South Carolina, and died after 1860 in Bradley County, Arkansas. He married (2), Mary LANSDALE, sister of Isabel, in Bradley County, Arkansas, after Isabel died. Mary was born about 1834 in Alabama. She died after 1880 in Washington, Bradley County, Arkansas.
- i. Joseph CARNLINE/CARNALA/CARNLEY, was born about 1825 in Monroe County, Alabama. He died on 22 Aug 1884 in Walton County, Florida. He married (1) Rosanna CARNLEY, daughter of George Carnley and Elinor (Unknown) on 04 May 1842 in Pike County, Alabama. She was born about 1825, probably in Pike County, and died there about 1845. He married (2) Mary Ann STEPHENS on 18 Mar 1846 in Pike County. She was born date Unknown, probably in Pike County. She died between about 1848 in Walton County, Florida. He married (3) Mary MURPHY about 1849 in Walton County. She was born on 16 Aug 1818 in Roanoke, Stewart County, Georgia and died about 1910 in Laurel Hill, Walton County, Florida.

He married (1) abt. 1820 in South Carolina Mary TILL, born abt. 1804 in Orangeburg District, South Carolina; died abt. 1840 in Lowndes County, Alabama, daughter of Nicholas TILL and Barbara BRUNNER; (2) Sarah Elizabeth LIVINGSTON.

Notes for Daniel COLEMAN: Daniel and Mary Till Coleman had 4 boys and 5 girls in all. Two of the girls died in their teens. However, only can prove through census records, marriage records, cemetery records, and living relatives. Also, Mary Till had a brother, John Till.

Children of Daniel COLEMAN and Mary TILL were as follows:

- a. Elvin Littleton COLEMAN, born 29 Sep 1828 in South Carolina; died 24 May 1914. He married on 25 Oct 1849 Martha Agnes BOULER.
- b. Allen G. COLEMAN, born 15 May 1830 in Lowndes County, Alabama; died 10 May 1900 in Allen, Alabama. He married (1) on 1 Mar 1855 in Clarke County, Alabama Nancy Elizabeth SOUTHALL, born 6 Sep 1834; died 10 Apr 1884 in Allen, Alabama, daughter of James SOUTHALL; (2) Isabelle Lavender CAMMACK. This line carried on by Mauriece Hinson.
- c. Betty COLEMAN, born 1834 in Alabama.
- d. Willard W. COLEMAN, born 16 Aug 1840 in Alabama; died 1 Oct 1924. He married on 15 Dec 1866 Margaret N. HOWELL.

He married (1) Mary ODOM, born abt. 1773, daughter of Benjamin ODOM (Sr) and Thamer [--]; (2) abt. 1817 in Barnwell, South Carolina Martha STIVENDER, born in Orangeburgh, South Carolina; died in Greene County, Alabama, daughter of Johann Eberhard STIVENDER (Sr) and Ann ZORN.

Notes for James W. COLLINS (Sr): After marriage of Martha Stivender to James Collins Sr., all the family of John W. Collins Sr. and Jr. moved to Greene Co. Alabama.

Children of James W. COLLINS (Sr) and Mary ODOM were as follows:

- a. James COLLINS (Jr), born about 1789, Winton, Barnwell County, South Carolina.
- b. Dorcas COLLINS, born about 1790 in Winton/Barnwell, South Carolina, married William NIMMONS. Both are buried in Nimmons Cemetery, Barnwell, South Carolina.

1. James Patmon COONER, a descendant of Jacob and Regina Kuhner of Orangeburgh District, was born about 10 Apr 1787 in Abbeville District, South Carolina and died in 1855 in Walker County, Alabama. He married Martha LOLLAR in South Carolina. Martha was born in 1794 in South Carolina, and died in 1858 in Jefferson County, Alabama. James and Martha migrated to Walker County, Alabama before 1830.

"COONER, JAMES P. came to Walker County from the Abbeville District, of South Carolina, in the early 1830's, and entered government land in Section 34, Township 14, Range 8, near Jasper, on September 23, 1833. He lived on a farm near Jasper all of his life and is buried in Walker Memory Gardens near Jasper. He was the father of James Carroll Cooner; Samuel Ellison Cooner; and Polly Cooner, who married, first, a Mr. Harrison Sides, and, second, a Mr. Townley." - Walter County Tract Record. Under Orangeburgh he lists Barbary Crum as a schoolteacher in Orangeburgh. In the 1850 census of Orangeburg Dist. there is a Darius Crum listed as a planter with two people in his household and 11.37 slaves. Also listed is Lewis J Crum, planter, 11 in Household and 12 slaves. In the 1790 census of Orangeburgh are listed David Crum, another David Crum, Jacob Crum and John Crum.

I also give or authorize to sell any part of the land that might fall to Rebeccas children and buy land where convenient for the same money for the children of Rebecca and that none of the income mentioned to Rebecca of the property shall be taken for no debts she or her husband may make whatsoever but the trustees above mentioned to have care over the property. It is my will that if an y of my children die leaving no child, their part of my Estate to fall back to my children that may then be living and equally divided among them. Lastly I appoint my three sons and Brotherinlaw Adam Fralick, John Fralick, Jacob Fralick, and Henry DeBardelabern Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven. Signed sealed and delivered this 17 day of June 1837."* The will was presented for probate on 26 June 1841. He married (1) in Pickens County, Alabama to Louisa Winifred WARD, born 29 Nov 1829 in Macon, Mississippi; died 11 May 1870 in Forest, Mississippi; buried May 1870 in Forest, Mississippi; (2) on 3 Jan 1871 to Mary Elizabeth CLARK, born 14 May 1820 in Clayburn County, Mississippi.

Notes for Daniel Wesley HAMITER: The following is a copy of an Autobiographical sketch by Daniel Wesley Hamiter. *The under signed was born in Fairfield County, South Carolina, on the*

15th day of June 1819. "My parents had 10 children, Viz. the undersigned, William S., George W., Mary E., Frances W., Martha C., Joel, Hiram, and John Tyler Hamiter. "I spent my time on the farm and going to school up to the year 1835, when I immigrated with my parents to Pickens County, Alabama. I lived in this county 24 years. During this period I went to high school at Pleasant Ridge, Pickens County, taught by R. S. Gladney, a Presbyterian Minister, 2 years, farmed 3, taught 4, and carried on at _____ [original torn] a forwarding and receiving business 15. I joined the Oak Presbyterian Church in 1839. "I married Louisa W., oldest daughter of Col. Jno. Ward. July 13, 1848 [original torn] Miss during _____ [original torn] to Garlandville 1870, thence to Houston, Miss. 1873, thence to Macon, and back to Houston 1883 where I now reside. It will here be observed that a teacher by profession does not as a rule remain long at a place. This state of affairs does not generally arise so much on the part of the students, but the parents. "I was selected a Ruling Elder of the Presbyterian Church at Frankonia, Alabama in 1850. Afterwards I served in this capacity in the following churches, Viz. Moriah, Newton County, Miss., Forest, Scott County, Garlandville, Jasper County, Macon, Noxubee County, and lastly Houston, Chickasaw County. "I have frequently been delegated to our Presbyterial, once to the Synod, and once to the General Assembly in the U. S. I am an advocate for Sabbath Schools, having been a scholar in them during my youth and acted as Superintendent in them for many years past in all of the above named churches. Ex-Officio I am a member of our County Sabbath School Conventions, and have been a president of the same in 3 different meetings. I am an advocate for family worship and try in my feeble manner to perform this Sacred duty during night and morning. The older I become the more confirmed am I in the doctrine taught by the Presbyterian Church. Yet I object to some phraseologies in the Confession of Faith. For example, on page 64 it is said that infants dying in infancy are regenerated and saved in Christ, etc. From this expression an inference or deduction could be reasonably drawn that some infants are not of the elect. As to politics, I have always been a Democrat and admirer of Jno. C. Calhoun, Jefferson Davis, etc. since they are strict constructionists of the constitution of the U. S. and against nullification and secession provided this instrument was obeyed by the Northern States. "I am small in size, 5 ft. 8 inches in height, usual weight 117 lbs. and never over 120 lbs. "On Mat 11th, 1870 my wife died at Forest. She had been an invalid for 2 years disease Chronic Diarrhea. During her illness she manifested Christian patience and resignation and finally expired triumphantly in Christian faith. She was a devoted member of our Presbyterian Church, a true wife to me and a fond mother to our children. The fruit of our marriage consisted of 5 sons and 3 daughters Viz., Everett Newton, Louisa Frances, John Wesley, Marietta Elizabeth, Martha Miles, George Frederick, William Scott and Frederick Augustus. All of them dead except the 1st, 5th, and 7th. "My living children are members of the Presbyterian Church, the oldest son a deacon of this church and a merchant of Macon. My daughter the wife of E. F. Medlin, Chancery Clerk at Houston, youngest son a Presbyterian Minister at Blackburg, S. C. "I was married the second time to Mary E., oldest daughter of James P. Clark and Eliza Clark, at Forest. This marriage, like the first, proved to be a happy and fortunate one. She is a true wife to me and as much concerned for the temporal and spiritual welfare of

our children as a devoted mother could be. "As to the Genealogy of the undersigned and that of his first and 2nd wives, but little is to him. My great paternal grandfather emigrated from Germany to this country. He had 2 sons, Viz., Adam and Jacob, who were citizens of S. C. The former is my grandfather who married Barbara Turnipseed by whom he had 6 children Viz., Nancy, Frederick, George, Polly, David, and John. The latter had 3 sons, Viz., David John, and Joel. The children of Adam and Jacob Hamiter received but a limited education and none of them succeeded in accumulating a large fortune, except those 3 sons of Jacob. My great maternal grandfather, Benjamin Scott, emigrated from England to this country who had a son, Benjamin who was a citizen of S. C. The latter 1st married a Miss Shaver by whom he had 6 children, Viz., Hiram, Margaret, Elizabeth, Frances, Daniel, and Nancy. He married a 2nd time a Miss Ruff by whom he had 3 daughters Viz., Susan, Polly, and Tamar. "The Religious Tenents of my paternal ancestors were Luthern and Presbyterian, and that of my maternal were Methodist. "The name of my Father was George Frederick, child of Adam Hamiter and that of my mother Frances, 5th child of Benjamin Scott. The avocations of my ancestors was therally[?] that of farming. My paternal grandfather was a soldier in the Revolutionary War. "The longevity of my ancestors was short upon the whole, not over 60 years. Daniel, a brother of my father, however lived to the age of 72. Hiram, a brother of my mother, to that of 85 while others on both sides lived only 40 to 50. "My father was born Jan. 22, 1795 and died of measles, May 7th, 1845. My mother was born Feb. 24th, 1802 and died of perhaps Erysipelas May 25th, 1878 having lived 76 years and my father 50. My parents were buried in the family cemetery 4 miles east of Carrollton, Alabama. "My 1st wife's great paternal grandfather emigrated from France to this country and settled in Virginia. He never made any religious profession but had a son who was a Baptist minister. Her maternal great grandfather was a native of Wales he emigrated to this country and settled in N. C. Her father's name was John Ward and that of her mother Louisa Ward. Her father was married twice. By the first wife he had 3 daughters, Viz., Louisa, Sarah J., Cornelia H., Mariette, Augustus, Eugene, Milton, Ella, Clio, and Charles. Others died in infancy. The father of above named children is dead having lived to the age of 90. This family is mostly Baptist. "My 2nd wife's paternal grandfather lived in Kentucky, his name was James Clark and he belonged to the Campbellite or Christian Church. At one time he was very wealthy and had been a teacher by profession lived to the age of 84 years. Her Maternal grandfather, Phillip Briscoe lived in Maryland and was wealthy. Her maternal grandmother Elizabeth Mason was a daughter of that Mason from whom Bayou Mason took its name. She was an educated lady, wealthy and a member of the Methodist Church. My 2nd wife's father's name was James P. Clark, a native of Kentucky but emigrated to Miss. He was married during the year 1828 to Elizabeth Briscoe. The fruit of this marriage consisted of 11 children, Viz., Mary E., J. D., Warren, Francis F., Susan A., Henrietta M., Richard P., Caroline J., and Eliza D. The others died during infancy. J. P., Warren died of pneumonia at Canton 1871, Francis D. was killed at the Battle of the Wilderness, Va., in 1864. And their father recently died in his 86th year having lived with his wife 63 years. This family is mostly Methodist. "Before I close this writing I would like to state that I have two daughters buried at Pleasant Ridge,

Alabama. My 1st wife at Forest, and 3 sons at Mt. Moriah. It will therefore be seen that I have had much serious and fatal sickness in my family; my affliction and bereavements have fallen heavily upon me yet I feel that my Heavenly Father has blessed me in these afflictions and that I can say with the Apostle, 'It was good for me that I was afflicted.' Upon the whole I have lived up to date a happy and contented man. "My general health has been good, but better since the age of 40. I was under the control of my parents 21 years, engaged in the receiving and forwarding business 15, bookkeeping 4, farming 5 and teaching school 27. I lived in S. C. 17 years, Ala. 24 and Miss to date 31. I thank my Heavenly Father that he has prolonged my life beyond that time allotted man to pray that he may bless what little good I have done and for the sake of Jesus Christ, My beloved Savior, he will forgive my sins of omission and commission. "It is not necessary that I should make a will for I know that my children will do what is right and just for my wife, if she survives. If not done before my death my children will not forget to place tombstones over our departed one at Forest and Mt. Moriah. It is my wish that this record be kept safely in some family Bible and be handed down to my nearest descendants as it may be interesting to them. "Dedicated to my wife and children this day A. D. June 15, 1891." (signed) D. W. Hamiter

Notes for Louisa Winifred WARD: Frances Scott Hamiter was living in Pickens County, Alabama at the time of the 1850 census. She was a widow with the following children living with her: George, Martha, James, Hiram, and John, ages from eight to twenty-five years.

William Scott HAMITER, born 25 Aug 1821 in Fairfield County, South Carolina; died 23 Jan 1893 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried 23 Jan 1893 in Union Chapel Cem., Carrolton, Pickens Co., Alabama. He married (1) on 25 Nov 1845 in Pickens County, Alabama to Mary Elizabeth Ruff CONNERLY, daughter of David CONNERLY and Anna Catherine TURNIPSEED; (2) on 4 Jul 1886 in Pickens County, Alabama to Mary M. - c. George Washington HAMITER, born 25 Aug 1823 in Fairfield County, South Carolina; died 1895 in Lampasas Springs, Texas. Notes for George Washington HAMITER: George Washington Hamiter attended Tulane University, became a medical doctor and lived at one time in Monroe, Louisiana. He later moved to what became his last known address at the time of the filing of his brother William Scott's will in 1893, to be Lampasas Springs, Texas. He was known to have descendants living in the Louisiana area as well as Texas. At the present time, 1992, he has a great-granddaughter, Mary Etta Bean, living in Amarillo, Texas, and great-grandsons John Fox in Georgetown, Texas, and Charles Fox in Belton, Texas.

- d. Mary Ann Elizabeth HAMITER, born 27 Dec 1825 in Fairfield County, South Carolina; died 16 Sep 1909 in Texas. She married in 1846 in Pickens County, Alabama to John James

CUNNINGHAM, born 2 Dec 1821 in Kershaw County, South Carolina; died 4 Jun 1853. Mary was baptized by Rev. Reddick Pierce.

- e. Frances Weston HAMITER, born 18 Oct 1827 in Fairfield County, South Carolina; died 23 Nov 1839 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried in Hamiter Cem., Pickens County, Alabama. Frances was baptized by Rev. Reddick Pierce. She died young without marrying.
- f. Martha Caroline HAMITER, born 28 Jul 1831 in Fairfield County, South Carolina; died 1 Oct 1920 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried Oct 1920 in Union Chapel Cem., Carrolton, Pickens Co., Alabama. She married on 13 May 1874 in Pickens County, Alabama to Joseph F. FASON, born 28 Apr 1823; died 6 Feb 1900 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried in Union Chapel Cem., Carrolton, Pickens Co., Alabama. Martha was baptized by Rev. Samuel Dunwoody.
- g. Nancy Margaret HAMITER, born 9 May 1833 in Cedar Creek, Richland County, South Carolina; died 24 Feb 1836 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried Feb 1836 in Hamiter Cem., Pickens County, Alabama. Nancy was baptized by Rev. Joseph Holmes. She died young without marrying.
- h. Joel James HAMITER, born 13 Apr 1836 in Pickens County, Alabama; died 29 Mar 1884 in Naruna, Burnet County, Texas; buried in Naruna, Burnet County, Texas. Joel was baptized by Rev. George Schaeffer. Joel fought in the Civil War in Company H, 11th Alabama Regiment, under General Robert E. Lee. The Company called themselves the Pickens County Guards, which fought primarily in Virginia with the Army of Northern Virginia. After returning from the war he moved to Texas. Joel never married.
- i. Hiram Pickins HAMITER, born 30 Sep 1838 in Pickens County, Alabama; died 3 Sep 1854 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried Sep 1854 in Hamiter Cem., Pickens County, Alabama. Hiram was baptized by Rev. George Schaeffer. He died young without marrying.
- j. John Tyler HAMITER (Sr), born 26 Aug 1841 in Pickens County, Alabama; died 7 Nov 1926 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried in Union Chapel Cem., Carrolton, Pickens Co., Alabama. He married (1) on 7 Nov 1865 in Pickens County, Alabama to Margaret Ann MCCAFFERTY, born 19 Oct 1847 in Pickens County, Alabama; died 8 Oct 1893 in Pickens County, Alabama; buried Oct 1893 in Union Chapel Cem., Carrolton, Pickens Co., Alabama; (2) on 10 Apr 1895 in Aliceville, Pickens Co., Alabama to Julia TRANTHAM, born 21 May 1852 in Pickens County, Alabama; died 10 Jan 1929 in Alabama; buried Jan 1929 in Franconia Cem., Aliceville, Alabama.

Notes for John Tyler HAMITER (Sr): John Tyler Hamiter planned to follow his brother, George Washington Hamiter, into the medical field, but he joined Company H, 11th Alabama Regiment, Confederate Army under General Robert E. Lee. His Company was known as the Pickens County Guards. He was wounded three times during his military service; once in the leg, once in the head, and once in the arm. The leg wound was rather serious, the head

wound was a glancing wound, and the arm a flesh wound. During his remaining lifetime he suffered with severe headaches, which he attributed to his head wound. The following is from the book, *The History of Pickens County, Alabama 1540-1920*: *On August 6, 1892 the office of sheriff was won by the well known Civil War Veteran Mr. John Tyler Hamiter. Sheriff Hamiter was the son of John William Hamiter (sic), who came to Pickens County from Richland District, South Carolina. He was born and reared in this county, first seeing daylight on August 26, 1841. "Sheriff Hamiter returned from the war in good health and never convinced that the South lost the great struggle. There were many stories passed down through the years relating to Uncle Tyler and the Civil War. One of the most amusing stories took place after a reunion had been held at Chickamauga, which was attended by one Hiram Scott of Carrollton. Mr. Scott returned from the affair and had in his possession two or three walking canes as souvenirs. He approached Uncle Tyler and told of having met a yankee veteran at the reunion and during their conversation the yankee asked Mr. Scott where he was from and upon finding he was from Carrollton, the yankee gave Mr. Scott a walking-cane to give to Sheriff Hamiter for he (the yankee) knew that Uncle Tyler needed a cane after having been on the run during the entire war. All this took place in the rear of W. G. (Billy) Robertson's store before a large pre-arranged crowd and some of the old people said it was two or three days before Uncle Tyler quieted down. "Sheriff Hamiter served the entire war, took part in some of the fieriest battles as a member of Company H, 11th Alabama Regiment, under Wilcox. "Sheriff Hamiter made the County a good law officer, serving his entire term without serious incident. He was very outspoken and made no secret of where he stood on any subject that arose. He was one of the strongest leaders in the country during the days of the Radical Republican Carpetbagger Scalawag days. "During the latter days of his life, John Tyler Hamiter Sr., and his wife Julia, lived with his son John Tyler Jr., in a large country home known as the Lipsey-Hamiter Home, built in 1837 and burned in 1939. This home was approximately four miles southeast of Carrollton, Alabama. John Tyler Hamiter Sr., died of pneumonia on November 7, 1926. The following is the obituary of John Tyler Hamiter Sr., published in the Pickens County Herald/West Alabamian on November 11, 1926: "John Tyler Hamiter, prominent citizen and one time sheriff of Picken, died at his home four miles east of Carrollton Sunday night at 10:00 o'clock, from an attack of pneumonia. He was taken sick more than two weeks prior to his death, but was never able to fight off the disease. "Mr. Hamiter was born August 26, 1841, near Carrollton, and lived his whole life here. He volunteered as a private at the beginning of the Civil War, fought throughout the entire war without being captured, but was wounded three times. He engaged in some of the fiercest battles of Virginia. He was a member of Company H, 11th Alabama, under Wilcox, and his comrades who survived said he was as brave as ever went into a battlefield. "Mr. Hamiter was elected sheriff of this county many years ago and made a splendid officer. He maintained the same fearless spirit in office as he did on the battlefield. He was fair and just to his fellowman, and his word was his bond. He was considered one of the strongest and most active men of his age in the county, and was till his last illness. He was popular wherever he was known, and took active interest in all*

matters, political, religious and social. The county loses one of the best men in the death of Mr. Hamiter. "He is survived by his widow and two sons, W. F. Hamiter and J. T. Hamiter Jr., all citizens of Carrollton beat. Funeral services were conducted by Rev. C. E. Kaylor, pastor of the Methodist Church of Carrollton, of which he was a member. He was buried at Union Chapel Cemetery five miles south of Carrollton Monday afternoon. Despite a heavy down pour of rain all afternoon, a large number of friends over the county attended the funeral services, and the floral offering was evidence of the esteem his friends had for him. Mr. Hamiter will be greatly missed by his friends in Carrollton. He came to town, practically every day when he was not busy on his plantation, and was greeted by old and young alike, as Uncle Tyler. He was a great friend to the young men and children, and never passed them without a friendly greeting."

1. George Henry HARTZOG was born 1795 in Barnwell County, South Carolina, and died 03 Aug 1837 in Barbour County, Alabama. He married (1) Sarah TYLER Abt. 1814. She was born Abt. 1795, and died Abt. 1830 in South Carolina. He married (2) Celia BAXLEY Abt. 1830 in South Carolina, daughter of John BAXLEY and Mary STEVENSON. She was born 1811 in South Carolina, and died Aft. 1897 in Barbour County, Alabama.

Notes for George Henry HARTZOG: George and his first wife Sarah are found listed in Book A, pg 267 as owning land on Sykes Creek, South Edisto, Barnwell County, South Carolina. Nearby is a Lewis Tyler, George Fair, and Young Welch.

George is the founder of the HARTZOG family in Barbour County, Alabama. Early in 1837, the family moved to Barbour County, and George applied at the land office in Sparta, Alabama for 80 acres of land for which he paid \$1.25 an acre. On June 1838, we find a petition for dower for Sela (Celia) Hartzog.

Documented records of two land grants in Alabama dated August 24, 1837 (Nos. 5706 and 5707) are issued to George Hartzog and signed by him. He is believed to have died the latter part of that same year, 1837. Celia Hartzog (2nd wife of George) lived on for several years. Someone has said that she was recorded at Clayton, Alabama., to have received a pension after the death of her husband.

We have searched for his burial place, but have not found a marked stone in the cemeteries close around where he lived. Many early Barbour County burials were on family property, and were marked with cypress markers rather than stone. Stone became affordable for many families only with the advent of the railroad. As a consequence, the majority of pre-1840 burials in the area are now unmarked, and most have returned to fields and woods.

Notes for Isaac HARTZOG: Isaac was killed in the Civil War.

Notes for Daniel S. HERLONG: Daniel S Herlong was in Lowndes County, AL by 1840 (census). Sometime between 1840 and 1949 he settled on preemptive property in Jackson Parish, Louisiana. He moved back to Ft. Deposit (Lowndes County) Alabama in 1849 and died there in

Jones married Maria Catherine Stehely from Orangeburg, South Carolina and moved to Pike County, Alabama in 1837-38, 3 of their children who were born in SC Carrie Jones Boyd and her husband Alfred Boyd, son of Archibald or (Newberry Co., SC) came with them and Hansford S. Jones and Urban Louis Jones. Their other children in Alabama must have been named for Basil Manley Jones (from a Rev. Basil Manley) and where the names Lotan Jones and Septimus came from. Can not find out where Vossius Jones, a cousin came from...he was in Pike Co. also. These Joneses arrived in Alabama about the time that Rebecca Jones or the other sister Eleanor (both married to Salley boys, Uriah and John Henry Salley) went to Mississippi. They sold many acres and what happened to the slaves I don't know but by buggy they moved to Mississippi. The only other son of Henry and Mary Pou Jones was Louis Jones and he married Ann Elizabeth Pou and their dau. Rebecca Margaret Jones married a Lewis (sic) Jones. (no kin). They were known as the Edgefield Joneses and are buried there with 3 of their children in the old Jones cemetery that is now surrounded by houses. This Rebecca was named for her Father's sister Rebecca Jones Salley and the name Margaret came from her Gt Grandmother Margaret Mureno Pou. One of the Jones girls married a Rambo and went to Alabama, another married Livingston, another a Friday and one married a Wolfe.

Notes for Maria Catherine STEHELY: Migrated to Pike County, Alabama in 1836 with three of thier children. Rest born in Alabama. Maria married second Richard Locke on 25 January 1843 in Montgomery County, Alabama.

At the age of fifteen he slipped away from the TAYLORs and began a long walk to Alabama where other relatives had previously moved. He patiently made his way on foot to Camden, AL. Speaking of the journey in later years, Andrew said he never begged a meal during the entire journey. He retained this sense of pride, independence and rugged honesty throughout his long and useful career. While at Camden, he set aside wages in order to attend school, thus attaining a practical knowledge of reading, writing, spelling and arithmetic. He married Miss Hespah Williamson, and had a son named Emanuel Wesley HOLMAN (named after Andrew's oldest brother). Hespah died when the child was seven years old. He then moved to Baldwin County, AL, finding employment in the sawmills along the Tensas River near Blakely, AL, the thriving little county seat. In the meantime, Mrs. Henry TAYLOR, the aunt who had given Lewis a home in his early childhood days, had moved from South Carolina and built a home near where Bay Minette, AL now stands. He placed his son, Emanuel, in Mrs. TAYLOR's care. He married Emily Arrabella Roberts, and then located along the Perdido River where he operated a ferry. They raised ten children to adulthood. Andrew felled timber on his property to build a schoolhouse, in which he taught his children and those of his neighbors. The school was also used as a church, later becoming the Clear Springs United Methodist Church. Andrew L. HOLMAN represented Baldwin County in the Alabama House of Representatives in the sessions 1868-1870. He was responsible for introducing bills to move the county seat of Baldwin County from Blakely to Daphne and a second bill to form a new county out of portions of Baldwin and Conecuh County to be called Escambia County.
