
CONTACTING A LOCAL CHAPTER

Obituaries

Social Security Applications & Claims Index (Not the SSDI)

Military Records

DNA

Gens 4 - Patriot
(great-grandparents through patriot)

Atleast one date and place required for each person in the lineage

Vital Records Birth, Marriage, Death

Church Records

Tombstone Images

Obituaries/Newspapers

Land, Probate & Court Records

Military Records

Bibles, Family Histories & Local Histories (on a case-by-case basis)

Documention Not Accepted

Bible records, census, gravestones, family or local histories for generations 1-3

Lineage papers from other hereditary societies

Online family trees

Unsourced family histories


Findagrave user-submitted data other than gravestone photos

Indexed information not from original sources

TOWN OR COUNTY WHERE YOUR PATRIOT RESIDED DURING THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

- Church or vital records showing the birth of a child
- Court minutes
- Land records
- Tax records
- Witness to a will
- Signed a legal document such as a petition



SOURCES OF REVOLUTIONARY WAR SERVICE

Army or Navy, State Navy, Local Militias, Privateers, Military Service of French Nationals in the American Theater



Military Service



Serving in a Provisional or New State Government i.e. Juror, Selectman, Constable, Surveyor of Highways, Justice of the Peace



Patriotic Service Oaths of Fidelity Rendering Material Aid or Aid to the Wounded, etc.

Application is complete

Step 2
Application is sent to DAR Headquarters



Step 3
Application is assigned to staff genealogist



Step 4
Application is verified or additional information is requested
