
Surf for Genealogy and Build a Tree


- Set your goals (write book, print big chart, family get-together hero, etc)

- Enjoy the adoration
















What is the Internet?

Dealing with Paper Pages


One by one...

(Even more important to record where you got them from)







What is it?


Five simple rules:

- 1. A reasonably exhaustive search
- 2. Each fact has an accurate source
- 3. Evidence is reliable and skillfully correlated and interpreted
- 4. Contradictory evidence has been resolved
- 5. Conclusion has been soundly reasoned and written.












A few simple things to keep in mind:


- The internet doesn't have all the answers.

- The Genealogical Proof Standard kept in the back of your mind will help you develop the skills of a master genealogy surfer.




Accurate Source Citations


Just figuring out exactly who the source is often brings up red flags


Now that you know the source, look at other product of that source and you can better gauge its quality

Sources also mean that you can recreate this later when your computer crashes (Did somebody say 'backup'?)

Make sure you included all the steps to find the data again ... enough so even your dog can find it ... and not because it smells bad.
