First Family Biography

The Martin Judy Family

First Generation

1. MARTIN JUDY was born about October 1697, in Lausen, Basel Canton (today in Basel-Land-schaft Canton, Switzerland), and was baptized there October 31, 1697. He was the son of Hanß Tschudi and Anna Madöri.^[1] Martin married ANNA BALMAR on March 10, 1727, in Lausen.^[2] She was born in the neighboring village of Furlen in March 1706, and was baptized in Lausen on March 28, 1706. She was the daughter of Hanß Jacob Balmer and Barbara Weißner.^[3] Martin, along with his wife, Anna Balmer, and their children; Hans Jacob, Anna, Barbara and Elizabeth, were listed on the 1736 Manumission Protocol for Basel Canton. He paid a 10% tax on 120 pounds, and a manumission of 20 pounds, for a total of 32 pounds.^[4] He and his family arrived in South Carolina in late 1736, or early 1737. He had a survey of 300 acres in the limits of Orangeburgh Township on the northeast side of the Edisto River, and Town Lot 279, certified for him on July 26, 1739.^[5] His plat was recertified by the Surveyor General on November 7, 1743, and his grant was executed March 1, 1744.^[6] Martin died sometime in or before 1752, when his widow, Anna, married Jacob Kuhnen. They were married at the church in Orangeburgh on July 21, 1752.^[7] Anna witnessed the baptism of Anne, daughter of Henry Salley, Jr., and Magdalene Huber, on April 22, 1753.^[8] She was also in attendance when her granddaughter Mary, daughter of John Platt and Barbara Judy, was received into the church at Orangeburgh, on November 30, 1755.^[9]

Children of Martin Judy and Anna Balmer were:

- +2. a. ANNA JUDY was born about December 1727, in Lausen, and was baptized there December 21, 1727.^[10] She died before 27 November 1784, in Orangeburgh District, South Carolina.^[11]

+3. b. HANS JACOB JUDY also known as Jacob Judy, was born probably around 1730 in Lausen. This would have been between the births of his sisters Anna in 1727, and Barbara in 1732.^[12]

+4. c. BARBARA JUDY was born about March 1732 in Lausen and was baptized there March 16, 1732.^[13]

+5. d. ELIZABETH JUDY was born about May 1734 in Lausen, and was baptized there May 16, 1734.^[14]

6. e. MARIA CATHARINA JUDY was probably born about 1742, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on September 19, 1742.^[15]

+7. f. HENRY JUDY later known as Henry Judy, Sr., was born probably sometime after 1742, in Orangeburgh Township, South Carolina.

Second Generation

2. ANNA JUDY was born about December 1727, in Lausen, and was baptized there December 21, 1727.^[16] She died before 27 November 1784, in Orangeburgh District, South Carolina.^[17] She married CHARLES HUTTO about 1745 in Orangeburgh Township.^[18] He was the son of Isaac Hutto, and Maria Catharina.^[19] Charles Hutto and Anna Judy had 6 children recorded in the Reverend John Giessendanner's Book of Record, but there were likely more. The ones recorded are as follows:

8. a. CARL HUTTO was born about 1747, in Orangeburgh Township, and baptized there March 15, 1747.^[20] He died probably by 1755, as he had a brother named Charles born then as shown below. Carl is a Germanic version of Charles.

9. b. SUSANNAH HUTTO was born about 1751 in Orangeburgh Township, and died there at the age of 1, on August 17, 1752. She was buried the same day and in the same grave with her grandfather, Isaac Hutto.^[21]

10. c. JOHN HENRY HUTTO, also known as Henry Hutto, was born May 26, 1753, in Orangeburgh Township and was baptized at the church there on June 10, 1753. His uncle, Jacob Judy, was one of his baptismal sponsors.^[22]

11. d. CHARLES HUTTO was born in 1755 in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on January 25, 1756. His sponsors included his uncle, Jacob Hutto, and his aunt, Anna Hutto Griffiths.^[23]

12. e. ISAAC HUTTO was born March 23, 1758 in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on April 23, 1758. The sponsors included his uncle, Isaac Hutto, and Margaret Dietrich, who later married his uncle, Jacob Hutto.^[24]
13. f. ULRICK HUTTO was born May 7, 1760, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on May 18, 1760. His baptismal sponsors included his uncle and aunt, Christian Roth and wife, Elizabeth Judy Roth.^[25]
3. HANS JACOB JUDY also known as Jacob Judy, was born probably around 1730 in Lausen. This would have been between the births of his sisters Anna in 1727, and Barbara in 1732.^[26] Though there is no baptism record for him, he was listed in the manumission protocol as having emigrated from Basel Canton.^[27] Jacob inherited his father's 300 acres and town lot. He sold it by Lease and Release to John Fisher in December 1769. According to the document, Martin had died intestate, thus the land was inherited by Jacob because he was the eldest son and heir at law.^[28] Jacob married DOROTHY BOSSART sometime before 1758, as indicated by the birth and baptism of their daughter, Margaret, named below.^[29] Dorothy was born in September 1736 in Zürich Canton, and was baptized September 23, 1736, in Wollishofen, Zürich Canton. She was the daughter of Jacob Bossart and Anna Schwarzenbach.^[30]

They had the following children, but there were possibly more:

14. a. MARGARET JUDY was born March 21, 1758, in Orangeburgh Township and was baptized at the church there on April 23, 1758. Her uncle Henry Bossart, and her aunt, Maria Catharina Judy, were two of her baptismal sponsors.^[31]
15. b. ANNA JUDY was born February 17, 1760, in Orangeburgh Township and was baptized at the church there February 24, 1760. Her sponsors included Margaret Dietrich, wife of Jacob Hutto, and her aunt, Anna Judy, wife of Charles Hutto.^[32]
16. c. HENRY JUDY was born around 1761, in Orangeburgh Township, and died in Orangeburgh District, sometime after 1830.^[33] In 1790, He was living next to George McMichael along the North Edisto.^[34] George had purchased the original Isaac Hutto tract of land along Limestone Creek, north of the Township, in 1774.^[35] This was near the original Martin Judy tract, which Jacob had inherited from his father, and later sold.^[36]
4. BARBARA JUDY was born about March 1732 in Lausen, and was baptized there March 16, 1732.^[37] She married JOHN PLATT sometime around 1749, likely in Orangeburgh Township. In spite of there being no direct evidence of this marriage, the baptismal sponsors in the church records are indicative of familial relationships as shown below.

They had at least 6 children, but there were probably more, especially in the interval between James and Hannah:

17. a. ANN PLATT was born May 8, 1750, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on June 3, 1750. Her baptismal sponsors included her aunts Anna Judy Hutto, and Elizabeth Judy, as well as Isaac Hutto, the father of her uncle Charles Hutto.^[38]

18. b. ELIZABETH PLATT was born October 28, 1753, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on November 25, 1753. Her baptismal sponsors included Ulrick Roth, the brother of her uncle Christian Roth, and Ann Hutto Griffith, the sister of her uncle Charles Hutto.^[39]

19. c. MARY PLATT was born October 24, 1755, in Orangeburgh Township. She was privately baptized in the house of the Reverend John Giessendanner on November 17, 1755, as she was a sick child. Her aunt Anna Judy Hutto was present at the baptism.^[40] Once recovered, she was presented and received at the Church in Orangeburgh on November 30, 1755. Her uncle Jacob Judy, and her grandmother Anna Balmer, wife of Jacob Kuhnen, Sr., were sponsors.^[41]

20. d. PATTY PLATT was probably born about 1757 in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on March 5, 1758. Her uncle Charles Hutto was one of her sponsors. Also included was Charles' mother Maria Catharina, who at the time was married to Henry Mell.^[42]

21. e. JAMES PLATT was born February 26, 1760, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on March 2, 1760. Anna, the wife of Jacob Bossart, was one of the sponsors.^[43]

22. f. HANNAH PLATT was born September 15, 1770, in Orangeburgh District.^[44]

5. ELIZABETH JUDY was born about May 1734 in Lausen, and was baptized there May 16, 1734.^[45] She married CHRISTIAN ROTH about 1753, likely in Orangeburgh Township. He was born in July 1725, in Matten, Bern Canton, Switzerland, and was baptized in Gsteig, in the same Canton, on July 17, 1725. He was the son of Hanß Roth and Christina Von Orth.^[46] As with Barbara Judy and John Platt previously mentioned, there is no direct evidence of this marriage. On June 3, 1750, Elizabeth, while still single, was a baptismal sponsor of her niece Ann Platt. On August 11, 1752, Christian Roth witnessed a deed from Peter Nägeli to Charles Hutto. In addition, Christian and Elizabeth Roth were baptismal sponsors for Ulrick Hutto, son of Charles Hutto and Anna Judy, on May 18, 1760. The baptisms of their own children reflect the kinship to other Judy family members.

Christian and Elizabeth had the following three children recorded in the Book of Record:

23. a. HANS ULRICK ROTH was born January 5, 1754, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on January 13, 1754. His uncles Hans and Ulrick Roth, as well as his aunt, Anna Judy, wife of Charles Hutto, were the baptismal sponsors.^[47]

24. b. CHRISTIAN ROTH was born February 19, 1756, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on March 17, 1956. His uncle, Jacob Roth, his aunt, Barbara, wife of John Platt, and Isaac Hutto, brother of his uncle Charles Hutto, were the sponsors.^[48]

25. c. ELIZABETH ROTH was born June 3, 1758, in Orangeburgh Township, and was baptized at the church there on July 23, 1758. Her uncle Jacob Roth, her aunt Catherine, wife of Ulrich Roth, and her aunt, Maria Catharina Judy, were the sponsors.^[49]

7. HENRY JUDY, later known as Henry Judy, Sr., was born probably sometime after 1742, in Orangeburgh Township, South Carolina. He was listed as a petit juror below Orangeburgh in 1778.^[50] In 1785, he acquired 100 acres of land on Wadboo Swamp.^[51] In 1796, he acquired another 500 acres, on Wadboo Swamp and Harvey's Branch.^[52] He died sometime after 1810, in Orangeburgh District.^[53] He and his unknown wife, had at least 6 children. The ones who moved to Alabama came to be known as Judah instead of Judy:

The known children of this couple were:

26. a. ANN "NANCY" JUDY/JUDAH was born sometime before 1770 in Orangeburgh District, and was likely married to PETER BROWN before 1790.^[54] On August 10, 1787, Peter had a 100 acre tract certified for him on Wadboo Swamp, which adjoined Henry Judy, Sr.^[55] Peter died sometime after 1820, as Ann was the head of household in the 1830 Orangeburgh Census.^[56] She later moved to Alabama, probably to be near most of her sons who had moved there earlier.^[57]

27. b. HENRY JUDY/JUDAH, JR. (later Sr.) was born about 1775 in Orangeburgh District, and died in Dale County, Alabama, sometime after 1840.^[58] Henry, along with his wife Nancy, and their children had moved to Dale County by 1830.^[59]

28. c. ELIZABETH JUDY/JUDAH was born probably before 1778 in Orangeburgh District, and was the wife of CHARLES HUTTO.^[60] He was born about 1774 in Orangeburgh District.^[61] They were in Henry County, Alabama, by 1830.^[62] Henry and Dale Counties adjoin one another.

29. d. JOHN JUDY/JUDAH was born before 1782 in Orangeburgh District. He was in Dale County by 1830.^[63]

30. e. MARY "POLLY" JUDY/JUDAH was born before 1790 in Orangeburgh District. She was first married to HENRY HUTTO, JR., son of Henry Hutto, Sr.^[64] Henry was born about 1792 in Orangeburgh District, and died about 1818, in Barnwell District, South Carolina.^[65] After his death, Mary married EDWARD CHITTY.^[66] By 1830, they had also moved to Dale County.^[67]

31. f. JACOB JUDY was born before 1790 in Orangeburgh District, and died December 13, 1873, in Colleton District, South Carolina. He married ELIZABETH HUTTO, daughter of William

Hutto, sometime before 1818, likely in Orangeburgh District.^[68] They were living in Orangeburgh District in 1820.^[69] By 1830, they had moved to Colleton District, where they were living next to Elizabeth's brother, Jacob Hutto.^[70] Elizabeth was born about 1800, probably in Colleton District, though later census show her older than she actually was.^[71] She died there sometime after 1880.^[72]

RESEARCH NOTES:

- A. Rev. John Giessendanner's records end in 1760. We see that John and Barbara Platt took their child Hannah to be baptized by Rev. Turquand in St. Matthews in 1770. It is very unlikely that this family, previously having children every 2-3 years, had no children in the intervening years.
